

Cherry Valley Parallel Force Main, Capital Project No. 1420
IEPA Project No. L17-4667

The Rock River Water Reclamation District (District) covers approximately 100 square miles of Winnebago County in northern Illinois. The District serves over 290,000 people in the communities of Rockford, Loves Park, Machesney Park, Roscoe, Cherry Valley, New Milford, Winnebago, a portion of Rockton, and several unincorporated areas within Winnebago County. The District owns and maintains a 1,126-mile network of gravity sanitary sewer lines that transport wastewater from residences, industrial sites, and other businesses to a wastewater treatment plant located at 3333 Kishwaukee Street, Rockford, IL.

Project Description

This project includes the installation of 16,081 LF of 30” diameter PVC force main piping and appurtenances to replace existing 30” diameter PCCP force main piping that is nearing the end of its useful life.

Community Benefits

This project will ensure continued, reliable sanitary sewer service to a significant portion of the Rock River Water Reclamation District’s service area, accommodate future service area expansion, as well as provide added protection in the case of a pipe failure between the Cherry Valley Pump Station and force main discharge nearly 2.5 miles away.

Funding for this project was provided by a low interest loan from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency’s **Water Pollution Control Loan Program (WPCLP)**. The WPCLP is funded by both state and federal sources.
