GENERAL SPECIFICATIONS AND INSTRUCTIONS ROCK RIVER WATER RECLAMATION DISTRICT INVITATION TO BID

SODIUM HYPOCHLORITE SOLUTION SUPPLY

2.1 Bid Preparation

Where applicable, the bidder shall submit his bid on the forms the District provides in this document. **The bidder shall complete all applicable blanks.** He may submit additional information, as he believes necessary on his stationery, under signature of the authorized representative who completes this document's forms.

If this Invitation to Bid contains inconsistencies between sections, Section III - Detailed Specifications shall supersede Section II - General Specifications, which shall supersede Section I - Notice. No warranty is made or implied as to information contained in these specifications.

An authorized officer or individual must sign the bid. Authorized signature must be the individual owner of a proprietorship, a general partner of a partnership, or the corporation officer whose title is affixed and is authorized to sign for the firm.

All prices and notations shall be in ink or typewritten. The respondent may cross out mistakes and type corrections adjacent to the point of error. The person who signs the bid shall initial such corrections, in ink. If the District finds a bidder's entry to be illegible, at its sole discretion, it may reject the bid.

2.2 Submission of Bids

The District will not receive bids in an electronic format or by facsimile. The bidder shall return his bid in a sealed envelope, clearly marked as "Invitation to Bid #21-201 Sodium Hypochlorite Solution Supply". The District cannot ensure that the sealed bid will not be prematurely opened if the bidder does not clearly identify his bid envelope.

2.3 Illinois Department of Human Rights Registration Number

All bidders inside and outside of Illinois must provide an Illinois Department of Human Rights Registration Number. If the number has not been obtained, it must be provided within 5 business days after the date bids are due. This number shall be written or typed on the line in the Fair Employment Affidavit of Compliance (included in the documents you receive). 2.4 Bid Security

Each bid must be accompanied either by cash, an <u>original</u> certified or bank cashier's check on a solvent bank or trust company, or a bidder's bond <u>(form attached)</u> from acceptable surety, drawn to the order of the Rock River Water Reclamation District in an amount of not less than ten percent (10%) of the bid price, issued by a surety company licensed to conduct business in the State of Illinois and named in the current list of "Surety Companies Acceptable On Federal Bonds" as published in the Federal Register by the Audit Staff Bureau of Accounts, U.S. Treasury Department. Failure to provide a Bid Security in the amount specified will constitute sufficient cause for rejection of the bid.

Within three (3) days after the opening of bids, the bid securities of all but the three lowest bidders will be returned. The bid security of the remaining two unsuccessful bidders will be returned within three (3) days after the execution of the contract, or, if no such contract has been executed, within sixty (60) days after the date of opening of bids. The bid security of the successful bidder will be returned only after he has duly executed the contract and furnished the required insurance.

2.5 Performance Bond and Payment of Vendor Bond

The successful bidder shall provide a Performance Bond and Payment of Vendor Bond acceptable to the Rock River Water Reclamation District. The performance bond shall be for either 100% of the contract price or for the successful bidder's unit price times the estimated number of units, as applicable. The performance bond may be for a term of one (1) year but must be renewed annually until the end of the Contract period.

This Invitation to Bid contains a Performance Bond form and Payment of Vendor Bond for the successful bidder's use.

If the successful bidder fails to provide acceptable bonds within the specified time or within ten (10) business days of the annual renewal date, he shall be in default.

2.6 Taxes

This District is exempt, by law, from paying bidder Federal Excise Tax and Illinois Retailers' Occupational Tax. Therefore, the bidder shall exclude those taxes from his bid. The District's tax exemption number is E9992-3696. The bidder shall include all applicable taxes in his bid price.

2.7 Withdrawal of Bids

At any time prior to the scheduled bid opening, the respondent may withdraw his bid. In order to do so, he shall submit a written request to the Director of Management Services.

2.8 Laws and Regulations

The bidder who is awarded the contract shall comply with all laws of the United States of America, the State of Illinois, and all lawful regulations of the Rock River Water Reclamation District and the respective cities and villages in which the professional service, material or equipment supplied is to be performed respecting labor and compensation and all other statutes, ordinances, rules and regulations applicable and having the force of the law.

A. Illinois Regulations

1. Prevailing Wage. All Contracts for the Construction of Public Works are subject to the Illinois Prevailing Wage Act (820 ILCS 130/1-12). The undersigned, as Bidder, declares he will comply with prevailing wages in accordance with the Illinois Department of Labor Standards. The State of Illinois requires contractors and subcontractors on public works projects (including Rock River Water Reclamation District) to submit certified payroll records on a monthly basis, along with a statement affirming that such records are true and accurate, that the wages paid to each worker are not less than the required prevailing rate and that the contractor is aware that filing false records is a Class B Misdemeanor.

Transcripts of certified payroll shall be filed using the IDOL portal at https://www2.illinois.gov/idol/Laws-Rules/CONMED/Pages/prevailing-wage-act.aspx

- 2. Public Act 83-1472. Article 2 of Public Act 83-1472 provides that Illinois residents be employed on Illinois public works projects, provided there has been a period of excessive unemployment (5%) in the State of Illinois as defined in the Act; and, further, that Illinois workers are available and capable of performing the particular type of work involved.
- **B.** Steel Products Procurement Act. Public Act 83-1030 entitled "Steel Products Procurement Act" requires that steel products used or supplied in performance of this contract or subcontract shall be manufactured or produced in the United States with three exceptions.

The provisions of this Section shall not apply:

- 1. Where the contract involves an expenditure of less than \$500.
- 2. Where the executive head of the public agency certifies in writing that (a) the specified products are not manufactured or produced in the United States in sufficient quantities to meet the agency's requirements, or (b) obtaining the specified products, manufactured or produced in the United States would increase the cost of the contract by more than 10%.
 - 3. When its application is not in the public interest.

2.9 Terms

- **A.** Payments to the Successful Bidder. If the District receives an acceptable invoice for conforming service prior to the fifth day of the month, the District shall issue payment before the fifth day of the succeeding month. If received on or after the fifth day of the month, payment will be issued the following month.
- **B. Default.** In case of default, the District will procure the service described in this Invitation to Bid from other sources. The District shall hold the defaulting successful bidder responsible for any excess cost incurred. The defaulting successful bidder shall make such payment no more than 60 calendar days after the District notifies him, in writing, of such an occurrence.
- **C. Brand Substitutions.** Bids will be considered for items complying substantially with specifications, provided deviations to the specifications are stated and items are described in detail. When offering alternate products, it is the responsibility of the bidder to outline alternatives and provide performance and technical data for evaluation. The Rock River Water Reclamation District will be the sole judge of whether such alternates are equivalent to the items specified. The District reserves the right to waive immaterial variations in the specifications.
- **D. Delivery Hours.** Unless otherwise specified, all items shall be delivered to: Rock River Water Reclamation District, 3333 Kishwaukee Street, Rockford, Illinois, 61109, Monday through Friday, between the hours of 7:30 A.M. and 3:00 P.M., excluding holidays.
- **E. F.O.B. Point and Shipping Charges.** All prices shall be quoted F.O.B. destination, Rock River Water Reclamation District, Rockford, Illinois. All shipping, handling and freight charges shall be included in the bid amount.
- **F.** Use of District Name Prohibited. In the absence of the District's written permission, the successful bidder shall not use the District's name in any form or medium of public advertising.

2.10 Investigation

Bidders are cautioned not to submit proposals until having carefully examined the entire site of the proposed work and adjacent premises and the various means of approach and access to the site, and having made all necessary investigations to inform themselves thoroughly as the facilities for delivering, placing and handling the materials at the site, and having informed themselves thoroughly as to all difficulties involved in the completion of all the work under this Contract in accordance with its requirements.

Bidders must examine the Specifications and other Contract Documents and shall exercise their own judgment as to the nature and amount of the whole of the work to be done and for the bid prices must assume all risk of variance, by whomsoever made, in any computation or statement of amount or quantities necessary to complete fully the work in strict compliance with the Contract Documents. The Bidder must satisfy himself, as to the character and location of the conditions and materials to be encountered or work to be

performed. No plea of ignorance of conditions that exist or that may hereafter exist, or of conditions or difficulties that may be encountered in the execution of the work under this Contract, as a result of failure to make the necessary examinations and investigations, will be accepted as an excuse for any failure or omission on the part of the Contractor to fulfill, in every detail, all of the requirements of the Contract documents, or will be accepted as a basis for any claims whatsoever for extra compensation or for an extension of time.

The Bidder, therefore, shall satisfy himself by such means as he may deem proper as to the conditions that may be encountered in construction of the work.

2.11 Addenda

If the District issues written addenda, such addenda shall become part of the contract documents. The District will email, fax, or mail the addenda:

- A. not less than 3 working days prior to the bid opening date;
- B. via email, mail, or facsimile transmission;
- C. to each recipient of the specifications, at either the:
 - 1. email address:
 - 2. mailing address;
 - 3. facsimile number;
 - 4. or corrected email address, mailing address, or fax number the prospective respondent subsequently furnished.

A bidder who does not receive the District's addenda, and who has previously submitted a bid, shall not be relieved from any obligation in the bid he submitted.

2.12 Contract Form

No more than 10 business days following the bid award, the successful bidder shall submit a completed Contract Form to the District's Director of Management Services. The Contract Form is part of this Invitation to Bid. By their mutual agreement, the successful bidder and District may supplement this contract form or replace it with an alternative document. If the successful bidder fails to complete the agreed upon Contract Form within the specified time, he shall be in material default.

2.13 Contract Termination

A. Bidder's Unacceptable Performance. If the successful bidder fails to perform services in conformity with this Invitation to Bid, the District shall notify him in writing. If the successful bidder fails to correct the performance deficiency to the District's satisfaction within five working days after he receives the District's notice, he shall be in default. If the same performance deficiency recurs despite the District's notification and the successful bidder's temporary correction, the successful bidder shall likewise be in default. The District may, at its sole discretion, terminate the contract with the defaulting successful bidder, and remedy the matter under provisions set forth in Section 2.9 B of this Invitation to Bid.

- **B. District's Action Following Contract Termination.** If the contract is terminated, the District, at its sole option, may:
 - 1. request new Sodium Hypochlorite Solution Supply Contract bids or
 - designate the next-low bidder to perform the Sodium Hypochlorite Solution Supply Contract, provided that said next-low bidder agrees to his original bid terms.

The District may repeat this option until it obtains an acceptable **Sodium Hypochlorite Solution Supply** contract.

2.14 Deliveries

The successful bidder shall ship all material as follows: F.O.B. Rock River Water Reclamation District, 3333 Kishwaukee Street, Rockford, Illinois, 61109, freight paid by seller. All deliveries shall conform to the requirements stated in this Invitation to Bid. In the unlikely event that the District is picketed by its employees or by a third party, or if any labor-management dispute between the District and its employees or third parties becomes known to the successful bidder, then in such event and during the course of any such picketing or labor-management dispute, the successful bidder shall continue to carry out the terms and conditions of this contract as if such pickets were not present or such labor-management dispute did not exist.

2.15 "No Bid" Response Form

In the event you elect not to bid, please fill out and return the attached "No Bid" form.

2.16 Indemnification Clause

Successful respondent/contractor shall protect, indemnify, hold and save harmless and defend the District, its officers, officials, employees, volunteers, and agents against any and all claims, costs, causes, actions and expenses, including but not limited to attorney's fees incurred by reason of a lawsuit or claim for compensation arising in favor of any person, including the employees, officers, independent contractors, or subcontractors of the successful respondent/ contractor or District, on account of personal injuries or death, or damages to property occurring, growing out of, incident to, or resulting directly or indirectly from the performance by the successful respondent/contractor or subcontractor, whether such loss, damage, injury, or liability is contributed to by the negligence of the District or by premises themselves or any equipment thereon whether latent or patent, or from other causes whatsoever, except that the successful respondent/contractor shall have no liability for damages or the costs incident thereto caused by the sole negligence of the District.

The indemnification shall not be limited by a limitation on amount or type of damages payable by or for the successful respondent/contractor or its subcontractor under any employee benefits act including, but not limited, to the Workers' Compensation Act.

No inspection by the District, its employees, or agents shall be deemed a waiver by the District of full compliance with the requirements of the Contract. This indemnification shall not be limited by the required minimum insurance coverage in the Contract.

2.17 Force Majeure

The obligations of either the District or the successful bidder shall be suspended during the time as such party is prevented from complying therewith in whole or in part because of any cause, except financial, beyond the reasonable control of such party. In the event of either the District or the successful bidder being rendered unable wholly or in part by force majeure to carry out its obligations under the **Sodium Hypochlorite Solution Supply** contract, other than to make payments due, it is agreed that on such party giving notice and full particulars of such force majeure in writing to the other party as soon as possible after the occurrence of the cause relied on, then the obligations of the parties insofar as they are affected by such force majeure shall be suspended during the continuance of any inability so caused but for no longer period, and such cause shall as far as possible be remedied with all reasonable dispatch.

2.18 Insurance

A. The successful respondent/contractor shall, for the duration of the contract, maintain the following:

General Liability: \$1,000,000 combined single limit per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury and property damage. If Commercial General Liability Insurance or other form with a general aggregate limit is used, either the general aggregate limit shall apply separately to this project or the general aggregate limit shall be twice the required occurrence limit.

Auto Liability: \$1,000,000 combined single limit per accident for bodily injury and property damage including coverages for owned, hired or non-owned vehicles, as applicable.

Workers' Compensation and Employers' Liability: Workers' Compensation limits as required by statute and Employers' Liability limits of \$500,000 per accident and \$500,000 per disease.

Umbrella: \$2,000,000 per occurrence/aggregate.

The policies shall contain, or be endorsed to afford Contractual Liability coverages for the following provisions in the General Liability and Automobile Liability coverages:

- 1. The District, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers shall be covered as additional insureds as respects liability arising out of activities performed by or on insured's general supervision of the successful respondent/contractor, products and completed operations of the successful respondent/contractor, premises owned, occupied or used by the successful respondent/contractor, or automobiles owned, leased, hired, or borrowed by the successful respondent/contractor. The coverage shall contain no special limitations on the scope of protection afforded to the District, its officers, officials, employees, volunteers, or agents.
- 2. The successful respondent's/contractor's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respects the District, its officers, officials, employees, volunteers, and agents. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the District, its officers, officials, employees, volunteers, or agents shall be in excess of the successful

respondent's/contractor's insurance and shall not contribute with it.

Any failure to comply with reporting provisions of the policies shall not affect coverage provided to the District, its officers, officials, employees, volunteers, or agents.

The successful respondent's/contractor's insurance shall apply separately to each insured against whom claim is made or suit is brought, except with respect to the limits of the insurer's liability.

- **B. Proof of Insurance** Certificate of Insurance. No more than 10 calendar days subsequent to the District's issuance of an award letter and no later than 30 days before commencement to work, the successful respondent/contractor shall provide documentation including a Certificate of Insurance and primary, non-contributory additional insured endorsements for general and auto liability to prove that it has obtained all required insurance and bonds. The District shall be the sole judge as to the acceptability of any such proof.
- **C.** Correction of Successful Bidder's Insurance Deficiencies. If the District determines that the successful bidder's insurance or documentation does not conform to these specifications, the District shall inform said bidder of the non-conformity. If said bidder fails to provide conforming insurance or documentation within five calendar days of the District's notice, he shall be in default.

D. Best's Ratings.

- 1. <u>Alphabetical Rating</u>. For purposes of this Request for Bids, "insurer" shall mean any surety, insurance carrier, or other organization which proposes to provide an insurance policy or bond for the successful respondent/contractor. No insurer or surety rated lower than "A-," Excellent, in the current <u>Best's Key Rating Guide</u> shall be acceptable to the District.
- 2. <u>Financial Size Rating.</u> Provided an insurer's alphabetical rating is satisfactory, the District will examine said insurer's financial size rating.
 - a. If <u>Best</u> classifies the insurer XII or larger, said insurer shall be acceptable to the District.
 - b. If <u>Best</u> classifies the insurer as smaller than XII, but larger than VI, said insurer shall be submitted to the District's Director of Management Services and/or the District's insurance consultant for review.

Financial Size ratings less than VII are not acceptable and will disqualify the respondent/contractor.

E. Suitability of Insurance. The District shall be the sole judge of whether an insurer's rating is satisfactory. The District's decision shall be final and the District's bidding procedures contain no appeal provision.

2.19 Responsive/Responsible Bidder

A. Evaluation of Responsiveness. The responsiveness of bidders will be judged on the basis of the completeness of the bid submitted. To be responsive, a Bid must be submitted on the forms provided as part of the Bid Documents and comply with all the requirements of the Invitation to Bid.

B. Evaluation of Responsibility. To be judged as responsible, the bidder shall:

- Have adequate financial resources for performance, the necessary experience, organization, technical qualifications, and facilities, or a firm commitment to obtain such by subcontracts;
- 2. Be able to comply with the required completion schedule for the project;
- 3. Have a satisfactory record of integrity, judgment, and performance, including, in particular, any prior performance on contracts from the District,
- 4. Have an adequate financial management system and audit procedures, that provide efficient and effective accountability and control of all property, funds, and assets;
- 5. Conform to the civil rights, equal employment opportunity and labor law requirements of the Bid Documents.

DETAILED SPECIFICATIONS ROCK RIVER WATER RECLAMATION DISTRICT INVITATION TO BID

SODIUM HYPOCHLORITE SOLUTION SUPPLY

3.1 Purpose

This Section contains a detailed description so that qualified bidders may submit formal **Sodium Hypochlorite Solution Supply** bids.

3.2 Minimum Requirements

A. Contract Duration. The successful bidder shall provide the District's Sodium Hypochlorite for a 36-month period, beginning at 12:00 A.M. on May 1, 2021, and continuing through 11:59 P.M. on April 30, 2024.

By their mutual written contract, the District and the successful bidder may extend the Sodium Hypochlorite Solution Supply contract beyond the termination date of the contract on a month-to-month basis for six months.

- **B.** Per-gallon Pricing. Sodium Hypochlorite prices shall be per gallon basis for 15% Sodium Hypochlorite Solution, delivered F.O.B. to the District's 3333 Kishwaukee Street location.
- **C. Price Increases Prohibited.** The successful bidder's bid price shall be firm for purchases during the awarded contract period.
- **D. Quantity.** If past patterns prevail, the District expects to use approximately 125,000 gallons of Sodium Hypochlorite annually. However, the District makes absolutely no warranty as to the quantity, if any, of Sodium Hypochlorite it will purchase from the successful bidder.
- **E. Size of orders.** The Rock River Water Reclamation District will normally place orders for tankers with a maximum of 4,500 gallons of Sodium Hypochlorite. Uncommon circumstances may require smaller orders be placed.

F. Weigh-In Procedures and Laboratory Analysis.

The successful bidder shall allow the District to weigh each truck load before delivery and after delivery. The District's scale is located at its 3333 Kishwaukee Street entrance. If the District's scale malfunctions, the successful bidder shall, at his own expense, drive his truck to an alternative scale, both prior to and following delivery. Such alternative weighing procedures shall be in effect until the District's scale is repaired, and the District shall make every effort to repair its scale expeditiously.

For purposes of analysis, each truckload shall be a unit and the successful bidder shall provide a sample at the delivery point, upon the District's request. If the District requests a sample of the Sodium Hypochlorite, the driver shall draw the sample from the tanker and place in a sample bottle provided by the District's delivery-point representative. The District may analyze such a sample by methods it determines to be appropriate.

The successful bidder shall provide a written laboratory analysis with each truckload of Sodium Hypochlorite. The successful bidder's driver shall present the analysis to the District's delivery-point representative at the point of delivery. Such analysis shall be prepared under laboratory methods acceptable to the District, and shall certify that the delivered Sodium Hypochlorite meets or exceeds any and all of the requirements contained in this Invitation to Bid. The District's delivery-point representative shall determine whether or not the delivered Sodium Hypochlorite is acceptable. Rejected loads shall be returned to the successful bidder at said bidder's expense. No more than 48 hours following such a load rejection, the District shall inform the successful bidder in writing as to why the authorized representative rejected the load.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CONDITION OF THIS OBLIGATION is such that if Principal shall promptly pay for all laborers, workers and mechanics engaged in the work under the Contract, and not less than the general prevailing rate of hourly wages of a similar character in the locality in which the work is performed, as determined by the State of Illinois Department of Labor pursuant to the Illinois Compiled Statutes 280 ILCS 130 / 1-12 et.seq. and for all material used or reasonably required for use in the performance of the Contract, then this obligation shall be void; otherwise it shall remain in full force and effect.

- 1. A claimant is deemed as any person, firm, or corporation having contracts with the Principal or with any of Principal's subcontractors for labor or materials furnished in the performance of the Contract on account of which this Bond is given.
- Nothing in this Bond contained shall be taken to make the Obligee liable to any subcontractor, material man or laborer, or to any other person to any greater extent than it would have been liable prior to the enactment of The Public Construction Bond Act, approved June 20, 1931, as amended; provided further, that any person having a claim for labor and materials furnished in the performance of the Contract shall have no right of action unless he shall have filed a verified notice of such claim with the Obligee within 180 days after the date of the last item of work or the furnishing of the last item of materials, which claim shall have been verified and shall contain the name and address of the claimant, the business address of the claimant within the State of Illinois, if any, or if the claimant be a foreign corporation having no place of business within the State the principal place of business of the corporation, and in all cases of partnership the names and

residences of each of the partners, the name of the Contractor for the Obligee, the name of the person, firm or corporation by whom the claimant was employed or to whom such claimant furnished materials, the amount of the claim and a brief description of the public improvement for the construction or installation of which the contract is to be performed. No defect in the notice herein provided for shall deprive the claimant of its right of action under the terms and provisions of this Bond unless it shall affirmatively appear that such defect has prejudiced the rights of an interested party asserting the same.

- 3. No action shall be brought on this Bond until the expiration of 120 days after the date of the last item of work or of the furnishing of the last item of material except in cases where the final settlement between Obligee and the Contractor shall have been made prior to the expiration of the 120 day period, in which case action may be taken immediately following such final settlement; nor shall any action of any kind be brought later than 6 months after the acceptance by the Obligee of the work. Such suit shall be brought only in the circuit court of this State in the judicial district in which the Contract is to be performed.
- 4. Surety hereby waives notice of any changes in the Contract, including extensions of time for the performance thereof.
- 5. The amount of this Bond shall be reduced by and to the extent of any payment or payments made in good faith hereunder.
- 6. The Principal and Surety shall be liable for any attorneys' fees, engineering costs, or court costs incurred by the Obligee relative to claims made against this Bond.

EXHIBIT A Sodium Hypochlorite Delivery Procedure

Scope: This procedure will cover the steps required to safely unload deliveries of

Sodium Hypochlorite.

Safety: Camlock Straps, Wheel Chocks, PPE (Apron, Gloves, Boots, Safety

Shield and Eye Glasses).

Equipment: T-Handle Wrench, Valve Box Tongs

Procedure:

1. Sodium hypochlorite tank trucks will stop at the security guard house to be weighed in. The security guard on duty will contact plant operations personnel informing them of the sodium hypochlorite arrival.

- Operations personnel will meet the tank truck at the guard house and verify all shipping paperwork and placards. Paperwork shall be initialed by the receiving operator.
- 3. The sodium hypochlorite tank truck will be escorted by plant operations personnel to the unloading area of the Chlorine Storage Building.
- 4. At the unloading site, plant operations personnel will inform the tank truck driver of the following **BEFORE** unloading:
 - Lock brakes (truck and trailer); listen for the hiss of the air release.
 - Driver must chock wheels as a secondary precaution. Visually confirm the placement.
 - Safety shower location.
 - Unloading pressure shall not exceed 15 psi.
 - Driver is required to remain within sight and 25 feet of the unloading connection point at all times during the unloading process.
- 5. After informing the truck driver of their responsibilities, operations personnel will use valve box tongs to open the valve access lids and the T-handle wrench to open and close the spill containment tank valves to the positions necessary for unloading.

Refer to Figure 1: Spill Containment Valve Locations picture below.

- 6. Operations personnel will verify that all of the valves in the sodium hypochlorite tank room are in their correct positions to fill the appropriate tank. Once the spill containment and the fill line valves have been verified to be in their correct position, the camlock cap outside the building shall be unlocked and removed allowing the truck driver to make his hose connection. The driver will secure his discharge hose with camlock straps and begin the offload process.
- 7. Operations personnel will remain at the Chlorine Storage Building until the sodium hypochlorite has been offloaded.
- 8. Upon completion of the sodium hypochlorite offload, the fill lines will be gently blown with compressed air from the tank truck to remove excess sodium hypochlorite in the lines. Operations personnel will then close all open fill line valves and return the spill containment valves to their normal positions. The exterior fill line camlock cap will be replaced and locked.
- The sodium hypochlorite delivery truck will be escorted by operations personnel to the guardhouse to be weighed out.
- 10. The sodium hypochlorite delivery paperwork, (signed Bill of Lading, SDS, Chain of Custody, weight ticket) will be delivered to the Financial Services Department.
